Dear Parishioners,


As you know, tomorrow we observe Memorial Day. Often this day marks the unofficial beginning of summer, usually with cookouts or picnics or maybe even a trip to the beach for a long weekend. While it is great to enjoy this holiday, we also must not forget the reason for it. On Memorial Day we honor, and pray for, all those who have given their lives in service to our country. We must not let the day pass without reflecting for a few moments on the sacrifice of so many and the fruit of their sacrifice, a land blessed with liberty and prosperity. Their sacrifice is one we can never fully repay. We can, however, honor them by seeking the greatest good for our fellow citizens. This can be done by recommitting ourselves to elevating the pursuit of virtue in our community life, in civic policies, in our laws, in education and in demanding virtue be a standard in the lives of those we elect to public office. 
