# A Message from our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners,

Did you know that in the our spiritual tradition each month of the year has a special designated devotion? We may be most familiar with May being the month dedicated to our Blessed Mother or even June being dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, but we may not be familiar as to what the other months of the year are dedicated. So here are the rest! January is the month of the Holy Name of Jesus. February is the month dedicated to the Holy Family. March is the month of devotion to St. Joseph. The month of April is dedicated to devotion to the Holy Spirit. July is the month dedicated to the Precious Blood of Our Lord. The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. September is traditionally dedicated to the Seven Sorrows (or Dolours) of Mary. October is the month of the Holy Rosary. The month of November is dedicated to the poor souls in purgatory. December is dedicated to the Immaculate Conception of Mary.

As you can see many of the months are dedicated to Our Blessed Mother under some of the various titles given to her. This should be no surprise to us for as we know, Mary, the Mother of God and our mother, is also the model of the Church. All that she is, the Church is in some way called to be.

Many of these devotions became associated with a particular month because of a feast day that is (or was) celebrated during that month.

Making the passage of time by being aware of the Church calendar, including the devotions of each month, is a great way to remind ourselves that our life is a pilgrimage of faith. We are not simply marking time, nor are our lives to be seen as controlled by random chance or lived without direction. We are going somewhere and we are going with a purpose. It is up to us, by cooperating with the Father's plan or not, whether the course of our life here is taking us to the heaven He has prepared or the hell He permits us to have. But either way, we are going to a very specific destination. By living a more deliberate life based on the Church's liturgical and spiritual calendar, we are reminded and helped to set course accordingly.

July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Our Lord. The Blood that coursed through the veins of Christ was a part of that Sacred Humanity made possible by the maternity of Mary, whose parents, St. Joachim and St. Anne are honored this month. (July 26). Our Lord's blood poured out on the Cross purchased our salvation, washed clean the robes of the martyrs, and gave birth to the Church as it flowed from his wounded side. The Precious Blood of Christ — now pulsing through his Mystical Body — continues its salvific work, preserving and purifying, repairing and providing nourishment for regeneration and renewal of its members. This month we contemplate all that our Savior gave us by the pouring out of His Precious Blood.

# OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

The origins of this feast reach all the way back to the Old Testament. In the book of Kings, we read the story of the prophet Elijah. Much of his prayer, fasting, and public ministry occurred from Carmel, a mountain in Israel. Christian hermits—seeking solitude—made their homes on the mountain during the first millennium.

Over time, the hermits assembled into a community and were given a Rule of Life. They named their church after Mary—Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Political upheaval forced the Carmelite order out of the

Holy Land and into Europe, where they established monasteries for both men and women across the continent. Many great saints and doctors of the Church have come from the Carmelite order, including St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Therese of Lisieux, and St. Edith Stein.
