A Message from our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners,

We continue our reflections this week, considering the Mass as a prayer of petition. It is right and fitting that we ask God for all that we need. It is His nature as the God Who is life itself, that all things good come from Him and it is His nature as the God Who is love itself, to give. As we are made in His image, we can understand how, when we love someone, we are happy when they come and ask our help. God desires us to seek Him and to seek all that we need from Him, and He desires to give us what is good. It is right and good for us to recognize our need to turn to Him, to depend upon Him for all things. In our private prayers we certainly can and should ask God for all that we need each day and we should ask good things of God for others each day too. While all genuine prayer is good, The Holy Mass is the most perfect prayer of petition. If we look at the individual prayers of the Mass, we see that from beginning to end the priest is asking God to grant many gifts for His people, the living and the dead, both individually and for the Church as a whole. These gifts include health and well being, protection from all evil, unity in the Church, mercy and forgiveness of sins, peace, holiness and most especially eternal life. The faithful, in prayerfully participating in the Holy Mass, ought to join their hearts to the words being spoken by the priest on their behalf. The center point of the Holy Mass is the sacred consecration of the bread and wine into the true Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus. This central moment is bracketed by the petitions of the Eucharistic Prayer. Our utter dependence upon God is made perfectly clear in this our most solemn and holy prayer. The Holy Mass ultimately leads us to the moment of Holy Communion. In this most intimate moment of union with Our Lord, we may speak to Him, asking Him for all we need. The Holy Mass also joins us to the universal Church in seeking God's gifts, this includes being joined to the prayers of the saints in heaven, who make up the "Church Triumphant". As if all this were not enough, there is still a greater way that the Mass is the perfect prayer of petition. As the ordained priest offers the prayers of the Mass, he does so as one sharing the priesthood of Our Lord. The ordained priest, at the Holy Mass, is acting not on his own, but "in persona Christi", in the person of Christ, so that it is Our Lord, our High Priest, who is acting through the ordained priest. The prayers and petitions of the Mass are linked to the eternal prayer of Christ, our High Priest, who forever makes intercession with His Father on our behalf. In this is found the true perfection and efficacy of the Holy Mass as a prayer of petition. How powerful a prayer it is, how magnificent a gift to us!
