# A Message from our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners,

As our Jewish brethren have just celebrated Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the Jewish holy days, we consider an element of the Holy Mass that has its origins in this Jewish ritual. On Yom Kippur the Jewish High Priest would symbolically place the sins the of the people on a "scapegoat" (a term coined in the middle ages that originates with this goat of burden). This scapegoat was then led into the desert and expelled, carrying the sins of the people, presumably it was sent away to die in the desert. A second goat was then sacrificed and its blood sprinkled in the Holy of Holies in the Temple. As Our Lord is the fulfillment of Old Covenant, what was done on Yom Kippur symbolically is accomplished in reality by Christ Himself, a reality made present in the Holy Mass. Our Lord Jesus is the true "scapegoat" who has taken our sins upon Himself. Recall during His passion the real guilty one, Barabbas, is set free, while Christ, the completely innocent and pure Lamb of God, is put to death. During the Holy Mass, the priest, right before the consecration, imposes his hands over the elements of bread and wine, soon to become the Body and Blood of Christ sacrificed for our sins. This gesture has come to be associated with what is called the "epiclesis", the invocation of the Holy Spirit. The understanding of this gesture as an "epiclesis" is an influence of the Eastern Catholic Rites upon the Latin Rite. In its origin, this gesture is from Yom Kippur, and is made as a sign of our sins being placed upon the Lord. The words prayed by the priest during this gesture give good indication of this: "Therefore Lord we pray: graciously accept this oblation of our service, that of Your whole family; order our days in Your peace, and command that we be delivered from eternal damnation and counted among the flock of those You have chosen."

In this prayer during which the priest imposed His hands over the elements to be consecrated, the hopes of Yom Kippur are fulfilled in Christ. He has taken our sins upon Himself and put them to death on His Holy Cross, thus gaining for us deliverance from eternal damnation and entrance in the Kingdom of His Father for all eternity. At every Mass we renew our trust that God has fulfilled His promise of deliverance and we rejoice that the sacrifice of the Lord is made present to us that we may turn to Him again and again, turning away from our sins and so enjoy the fruits of this saving grace.
