

A Message from our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners,



not decayed) during the process of his canonization. He has been widely venerated as the patron saint of hunters, archers, forest workers, those afflicted with rabies, as well as the patron of the city of Liege, the nation of Belgium and the people of the Ardennes Forest. He is one of the four special patron saints of the Rhineland, known as the Four Holy Marshals, who were invoked for protection against plague and diseases. He is also the patron of dogs, especially hunting dogs. As a nobleman he had his own prized hounds which he hunted with, and by the year 1000, the abbey of St. Hubert in Belgium began breeding and raising hunting hounds. Each year the monastery would send a pair of its prized hounds to the King of France as a gift. The modern bloodhound is thought to be a descendent of these hounds and one of the official names for the bloodhound in parts of Europe is "chien de Saint-Hubert" or St. Hubert's hounds. There are many hunting clubs, especially in Europe named for St. Hubert and his feast day, Nov 3rd, is the beginning of the hunting season in many places. We no longer celebrate his feast day on the universal church calendar, that day being given to a more modern saint, but it is still celebrated locally in places. Another curious fact is the use of the symbol for St. Hubert, a cross between the antlers of a great stag. This has become the symbol of the master hunter and is even used by the famous German liqueur Jagermeister, which means master hunter, on its label. The founder of this brew was an avid hunter and named his drink accordingly. Though St. Hubert is much remembered for being associated with hunting and though he lived so very long ago, he is still a great patron for all of us today. He had great zeal in converting people from paganism to the Faith. Today our society is falling back into paganism, marked by worship of the false gods of power and money, sexual immorality and a disregard for the sacredness of human life (over 57 million abortions in the US since 1973). These are the marks of paganism, then and now. Let's pray to St. Hubert for the conversion of our times and for the zeal to evangelize as he did.
