A Message from our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners,

As Fall is upon us and so is another hunting season, I thought we would revisit the life of one of my heavenly friends, St. Hubert, the patron saint of hunters. I have known his help many times in the field. If you are a hunter, you will find help in asking his intercession. If you have family or friends who hunt, you can introduce them to St. Hubert. And if you are not a hunter, you may find that the life of this great saint is quite inspiring and his intercession, for other reasons, very much needed in our world today. St. Hubert lived in what is present day Belgium in the 7th-8th centuries, we don't know his exact dates but he was born about 656 and probably died in the year 727. As a young man he was very worldly and lived a pleasure seeking life. He was an avid hunter, and in his day in Europe hunting was reserved for the nobility, and that's what Hubert was, the eldest son of the Duke of Aquitaine and grandson of Charibert, King of Toulouse. His favorite kind of hunting was called "the chase", hunting stag, a kind of red deer. The hunter rode a horse while the stag was flushed by hounds and then the kill was made by a bow, a spear or even a long sword. One Good Friday morning, while most others were in church, Hubert was on the chase, but then as he closed in on a great stag, the animal stopped and turned. Hubert was astounded at perceiving a crucifix suspended between its antlers, while he heard a voice from the figure of Christ say, "Hubert, unless you turn to the Lord, and lead a holy life, you shall guickly fall into the abyss of Hell!" Hubert dismounted immediately from his horse, fell prostrate on the ground and asked, "Lord, what would you have me do?" He immediately received the reply, "Go and seek Lambert and he will instruct you." Lambert was his bishop, whom he sought out and who became his spiritual director. Within the next year, Hubert's wife died while giving birth to their first child, a son, and soon after he decided to give up his royal position, including his birthright and personal wealth and study for the priesthood. He put his young son in the care of his own vounger brother, to whom he had passed on his royal birthright. He may have lived in a monastery for a time or even alone as a hermit in the Ardennes. Eventually he was ordained a priest and worked closely with Bishop Lambert. (Part 2 next week)


