A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

I think it is beneficial every so often to review how it is that God has communicated with us and what that all means in relation to what we often call the teaching of the Church. We call God's speaking to humanity as Revelation. God first spoke to Adam and Eve and later to and through the Patriarchs and the Prophets of ancient Israel. Sometimes He spoke in a miraculous and wondrous fashion so that He was heard with their own ears, often He spoke through His angels, and often in interior inspirations, but these in such a profound way that it was clearly from God and not a self inspired message. Finally the perfect Revelation of God is in the person of His Son, Jesus, the Word of God Himself become flesh. In the Letter to the Hebrews we read "In many and various ways God spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days He has spoken to us by a Son."

It is the Revelation of God though Our Lord Jesus that confirms the validity of all that came before, including the Scriptures of ancient Israel that make up our Old Testament in the Bible. Without Christ we would not know for certain any of that is true. Because of Christ we know that it is. St. John of the Cross teaches us: "In giving us His Son, His only Word (for He possesses no other), He spoke everything to us at once in this sole Word - and He has no more to say. . . because what He spoke before to the prophets in parts, He has now spoken all at once by giving us the All Who is His Son. Any person questioning God or desiring some vision or revelation would be guilty not only of foolish behavior but also of offending Him, by not fixing his eyes entirely upon Christ and by living with the desire for some other novelty." Because there is nothing God can add after revealing Himself in His Son, for in Him has given us everything, there is no new public revelation after Christ. This revelation of God has been entrusted to His Church, through and in the Apostles. It is to the Apostles that Lord gives His authority to teach in His name and the command to instruct the faithful in all that He has given to them. The content of this revelation is all that is necessary to know, to believe, and to do, in order to live well in this life and to have eternal life with God in Heaven.

We call the teaching of Jesus Christ, preserved and handed on by the Apostles, the Apostolic Tradition. It was given by the Apostles in two ways, orally in their preaching and their teaching and in writing by the Apostles and those closely associated with them who under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit committed the Gospel message to writing. The Church continues to preserve and hand on this revelation, which we call the deposit of faith, or simply the faith, also in two ways, through Sacred Scripture, the inspired written word, and in Sacred Tradition, the consistent and inspired life, worship and doctrine of the Church.

So that the deposit of faith may be preserved and handed on the Apostles chose their successors and ordained them as bishops, giving to them the authority to interpret and teach the Gospel as well as to govern the Church. This teaching authority is called the Church's "Magisterium". This means that the authority and responsibility to interpret the Word of God, as it is given both in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, is entrusted to the bishops who are in communion with the successor of St. Peter, the Bishop of Rome. The Magisterium is not superior to Sacred Scripture or Sacred Tradition, but is the servant of these and is to only hand on what has been drawn from the one deposit of faith. The Magisterium is not a source of Divine Revelation and cannot create new doctrine, but is to explain and apply what has already been revealed. As our Catechism teaches: The Church's Magisterium exercises the authority it holds from Christ to the fullest extent when it defines dogmas, that is, when it proposes truths contained in divine Revelation or also when it proposes in a definitive way truths having a necessary connection with them. There is an organic connection between our spiritual life and the dogmas. Dogmas are lights along the path of faith; they illuminate it and make it secure. Conversely, if our life is upright, our intellect and heart will be open to welcome the light shed by the dogmas of faith. The mutual connections between dogmas, and their coherence, can be found in the whole of the Revelation of the mystery of Christ. "In Catholic doctrine there exists an order or hierarchy of truths, since they vary in their relation to the foundation of the Christian faith." (CCC 88-90)

Though the Magisterium has the role of teaching and authentically interpreting the deposit of faith, we should also understand the deposit of faith has been entrusted by the apostles to the whole Church and all the faithful share in handing on and professing the faith. The faithful have the charism to believe the authentic Word of God handed on by the Magisterium in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. When the People of God are steadfast in their fidelity to Christ and live and practice the faith in harmony with their holy pastors, the Church is fully alive and is most effective in her mission to bring Christ to the world.
