

# A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

As we enter the third week of Lent it seems a good time for us to check our Lenten resolutions. If we have been made a personal commitment to the Lord to increase our prayer time, give up something in sacrifice or perform some extra works of kindness and charity, we might take a look at how we have been doing with that. If it has been going well then no need to do anything but continue. If we have been struggling then we might do well to take a look and see if we need a little "course correction". In navigating a ship at sea, just a minor correction of one degree will lead to many miles difference over time and make the difference in reaching the destination. So it is with our Lenten resolutions. In making a minor adjustment, by the time we reach Easter, we can be in a whole other place, spiritually speaking. Maybe our resolutions were too ambitious and we need to adjust them to be more realistic. Maybe our resolutions are just right, but we need to impose a little more self-discipline in doing what is needed to fulfill them. What have we let get in the way and how can we work around that? Maybe changing the time we are trying to fulfill these resolutions each day or adjusting our schedule or even placing them on our personal calendar. It is a good idea to write them down and keep track on a calendar of when they are fulfilled each day to help stay accountable. Whether it is a minor adjustment to the resolutions themselves or finding a way to be more intentional and disciplined about them, it is best to put the past few weeks aside, to not dwell on our failures but learn from them, and then start fresh. This is part of the beauty of the spiritual life, no matter where we are or have been, no matter our failings and even our sins, we can start fresh today. We still have a few more weeks of Lent and if we start our Lenten resolutions new today, when Easter comes we will find we are more ready than we thought we could be to receive the grace the Lord offers us on that most holy of days.


