A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

In the middle of July, the 16th to be precise, we have the great feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Carmel is a coastal mountain in the Holy Land, in Northern Israel. This mountain range is about 4-5 miles wide and some 24 miles long. The northeastern ridge has a steep face and is the highest area of the range at about 1800 feet above the sea. The mountain itself is consist of much limestone and flint and has many caves. To the southwest the mountain range slopes down and is covered with lush vegetation, including olive, oak, pine and laurel. The name Carmel, which means vineyard of God, is likely due to its lush vegetation. Sacred Scripture celebrated the beauty of Carmel where the prophet Elijah defended the purity of Israel's faith in the living God. From ancient times Carmel has been home to hermits and ascetics. In the 12th century, the Christian hermits living on Mt Carmel banded together into a religious community dedicated to prayer and contemplation, this is the first Order of Carmelites, dedicated under the patronage of Mary, the Mother of God.

Oppressed by the Saracens, the monks slowly emigrated to Europe. During the night preceding the sixteenth of July, 1225, the Blessed Virgin is said to have commanded Pope Honorius III to approve the foundation. Since the Carmelites were still under constant harassment, the sixth General of the Order, St. Simon Stock, pleaded with the Blessed Virgin for some special sign of her protection. On July 16, 1251, Mary answered his prayers and appeared to St. Simon and designated the scapular as the special mark of her maternal love. That is why the present feast is also known as the feast of the Scapular. The scapular, as part of the habit, is common to many religious Orders, but it is a special feature of the Carmelites. A smaller form of the scapular is given to lay persons in order that they may share in the great graces associated with it. The Scapular is an external sign of the filial relationship established between the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother and Queen of Mount Carmel, and the faithful who entrust

themselves totally to her protection, who have recourse to her maternal intercession, who are mindful of the primacy of the spiritual life and the need for prayer.

Pope St. John Paul II said of the scapular: "Therefore two truths are evoked by the sign of the Scapular: on the one hand, the constant protection of the Blessed Virgin, not only on life's journey, but also at the moment of passing into the fullness of eternal glory; on the other, the awareness that devotion to her cannot be limited to prayers and tributes in her honor on certain occasions, but must become a "habit", that is, a permanent orientation of one's own Christian conduct, woven of prayer and interior life, through frequent reception of the sacraments and the concrete practice of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. In this way the Scapular becomes a sign of the "covenant" and reciprocal communion between Mary and the faithful: indeed, it concretely translates the gift of his Mother, which Jesus gave on the Cross to John and, through

him, to all of us, and the entrustment of the beloved Apostle and of us to her, who became our spiritual Mother."

If you have never been enrolled in the scapular, I will be available after Mass on the July 16th to enroll anyone who wants. Simply bring a brown scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel with you and we will bless them and I will make the prayers of enrollment for you. Once you have been enrolled, the ceremony never has to be repeated, and

Prayer to Our Lady of Mount Carmel

O most beautiful Flower of Mount Carmel, Fruitful Vine, Splendour of Heaven, Blessed Mother of the Son of God, Immaculate Virgin, assist me this my necessity.

O Star of the Sea, help me and show me herein you are my Mother.

O Holy Mary, Mother of God, Queen of Heaven and Earth,

I humbly beseech you from the bottom of my heart, to succour me in this necessity; there are none that can withstand your power.

O, show me herein you are my Mother: O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee. (3 times)

when your scapular wears out, you can have a new scapular blessed anytime. If you have been enrolled and need a new scapular blessed, consider coming to Mass on the 16th and having your new scapular blessed and renew your dedication to Our Lady.

Miraculous Medal Novena


The prayers of the Miraculous Medal Novena are prayed publicly in our parish every Wednesday after the evening Benediction at 6:30PM. We offer public praying of the

Free standing admission to the grandstands as duties permit.


ALL are welcome: individuals, families, relatives, friends. Participants must be 16+.
