A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

During these Sundays of the Year, called Ordinary Time in the Church's Liturgical calendar, we have been reading from St. Mark's Gospel this year. Last Sunday took us right up to one of the most significant miracles of all, the feeding of the five thousand. Instead of continuing to read this miracle in the Gospel of St. Mark, our selection of Gospel readings now switches for a few weeks to the Gospel of St. John, where we will listen not only to his account of this miracle, but also much of what happened after it. So, for the next few weeks we will read almost the entirety of the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel, what we call Our Lord's "Bread of Life Discourse", His great teaching about the Holy Eucharist. I encourage you to read the entire sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel and to reflect upon it as we take these few weeks to reflect on the great sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Besides reflecting on this in our Sunday homilies, we will dedicate some time in our bulletin refections to consider the great gift and mystery of the sacrament we call Most Blessed. To begin, we look to the great teacher, St. Thomas Aquinas. Here is summarized by author Paul Glenn, some of St. Thomas' teaching on the transformation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Our Lord:

The words of consecration, pronounced by the priest, change bread and wine into the true body and blood of Christ. This sacrament is not a symbol or sign of Christ's body and blood; it is, in actual fact, the body and blood of Christ. By the consecration, the substance of the bread and the substance of the wine cease to exist, and there remains only the substance of the living Christ. The substance of the bread and the substance of the wine are not merely dissolved or disintegrated, either gradually or instantaneously; neither are these substances annihilated. They are changed into the body and blood of Christ. The whole substance of the bread is, by divine power, changed into the whole substance of the body of Christ. And the whole substance of the wine is, by divine power, changed into the whole substance of the blood of Christ. The accidentals or accidents of bread and wine (such as, size, color, shape, taste) remain after the change, which is called transubstantiation, has taken place. These accidentals do not become the accidentals of Christ; they remain the accidentals of bread and wine, even though the substance of bread and the substance of wine no longer exist to be qualified by these accidentals. The element in a bodily thing that makes it the kind of substance that it is, is called the substantial form of that thing. When a substantial form is joined with primal matter, it constitutes the matter as an existing bodily substance of a definite kind. Now, in transubstantiation, the substantial form of bread (that which constitutes the bread as this kind of substance and no other) is removed; it does not remain, for the substance is now not bread at all, but the substance of the living Christ. And the same is true of the substantial form of the wine; it does not remain, for, by transubstantiation, that which was wine is now not wine at all, but the substance of the living Christ. Transubstantiation is an instantaneous change. There is no consuming of time, no movement of the elements (bread and wine) through successive stages or degrees as the change occurs which turns bread and wine into the body and the blood of Jesus Christ. That which infinite power accomplishes need not be worked by degrees, or with time intervals, as though some effort and skill were being applied to the work.

Miraculous Medal Novena


The prayers of the Miraculous Medal Novena are prayed publicly in our parish every Wednesday after the evening Benediction at 6:30PM. We offer public praying of the


