

A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

Reparation is the act of making satisfaction to God for one's own sins and/or for those of others. Reparation is only possible because of our sharing in the life and mission of Our Lord. It is the Lord Himself who makes perfect atonement for our sins, and all sins, by the sacrifice of His life on the Cross and the bitter sufferings that this entailed. His sacrifice is perfect in every way. And so, we may ask, why is there any need for us to do anything more? The answer is that it is fitting for us as creatures made in God's own image and likeness to be participants in the Lord's work of salvation. St. Paul writes of "filling up" what is "lacking" in the sufferings of Christ by our own suffering. The lack is in us, not in Our Lord or His sacrifice. While it is fitting for us, and necessary by God's design, for us to be participants salvation by making reparation for sin, no action of ours nor the combined actions of every person, could ever make satisfaction to God for sin. Our offerings only have merit by being united with the sacrifice of Our Lord. Reparation does not mean we earn heaven but that we are demonstrating we are accepting the gift of salvation and therefore out of love for the Lord and a desire to fulfill Divine justice, we too, with Christ, offer something sacrificial, to our Father in heaven. Acts of reparation also aid in the re-ordering of our natures, for sin disorders us. Sin causes us to see less and less clearly what is right and what is wrong, this is the darkening of our intellect. Sin also causes our will to be weaker and weaker in choosing the good. These powers, intellect and will, become dominated by our passions, which they should be holding in check. Our human passions are not bad, in and of themselves, but they become dominant in us because of sin and cause us to live disordered lives. It is the saving grace of Christ that re-orders, restores, or we might say repairs us, but only with our co-operation. This co-operation is by acts of charity, acts penance, striving for virtue and prayer. These are all acts of reparation. They, in co-operation with grace, repair us, and our relationship with God and others. We cannot enter the presence of God for all eternity without this re-ordering, this repairing, of ourselves.

Our acts of reparation are also offered for others. We are part of the great Communion of Saints. We are therefore untied to each other and following the two great commandments, are to love God above all things and to love others for the sake of God. The second commandment of love of neighbor flows from the first and so our love of neighbor flows from our love of God. Only when this is so is our love without selfishness. The mission of Christ is a mission of salvation for the whole world, and so our mission is also to participate in being agents of grace for the whole world. Our acts of reparation will have the positive effect of the conversion of souls, will help increase the holiness of the Church and dispensing of grace to our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Our acts of reparation have merit because they are united with Our Lord's passion and this happens through participating in the Holy Mass and offering ourselves and our sacrifices daily with the Masses offered on every altar each and every day. Even when we cannot be present at Mass we can pray in union with the sacrifice being offered on altars the world over. This reparation happens also when we visit the Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. His abiding presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament offers us the opportunity to be united with Him and spend time with Him. These acts of reparation, especially when we come into His Eucharistic presence, also console Him in His passion. Our sins caused Him horrific pain, but our acts of reparation consoled Him. If we love Him we want to console Him more and more. If we love Him, we should want to make reparation for our own sins and as we look at the world around us, for the sins, the injustices, the sacrileges, and the indifference to Christ, especially the neglect and the abominations committed against Him in the Most Blessed Sacrament. In many Church's tabernacles He is left alone so much, never adored, never visited. There are so many sacrilegious communions received that so gravely offend Our Lord. We must not be indifferent to all this!

Come and visit the Lord often in our church. Come especially on Wednesdays to adore Him. To St. Margaret Mary Our Lord said: "Make reparation for the ingratitude of men. Spend an hour in prayer to appease Divine justice, to implore mercy for sinners, to honor Me, to console Me for My bitter suffering when abandoned by My Apostles, when they did not WATCH ONE HOUR WITH ME."
