A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

In just another week we will have the beautiful 50th Anniversary Mass with Bishop Schlert and our 50th Anniversary Gala. My thanks to everyone who has been working so hard to make this a beautiful day for all of us. So much planning and preparation has been done and now the day is upon us. I hope everyone will enjoy this celebration and realize what a truly great community we have here at St. Nicholas.

This year, in the 3 days after our Anniversary celebrations, we will have our annual 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration and Retreat. This will be a perfect way for us to continue to reflect on the meaning of this 50th Anniversary and pray for each other and the future of our parish, a family that is centered around Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. From Our Lord present in the Holy Eucharist we receive our identity as a Catholic parish, the graces and gifts we need to carry on with the mission of salvation and hope that will inspire our family to grow, now and in the future.

Our 40 Hours will begin on Monday evening with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 5:30PM, quiet prayer time with confession available until 6:15, and then at 6:30PM our first evening of prayer, meditation and Benediction. Tuesday and Wednesday, exposition and adoration will begin after the morning Mass, which is at 8:30AM, and will continue throughout the day until we being our second and third evenings (respectively) of prayer, meditation and Benediction.

Father Keaton Eidle, ordained this year in June, will be here each evening to offer our Eucharistic Retreat sermons, which will provide us with much food for meditation, on the path to holiness through devotion to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. He will focus on the Eucharist and humility, the Eucharist and knowing and doing the will of God and the Eucharist and Charity. I am so happy that Father Eidle can be with us and I know you will enjoy him and will find his sermons to be very inspiring and useful in seeing to deepen one's friendship with Our Lord.

These special days of Adoration are always an opportunity to grow personally and also to be a means of grace for our parish and for all those whom we brown before the Lord in our prayers. The following four fruits always come from a parish that devoutly celebrates these days of adoration:

- Adoration brings many blessings to the parish community and is one of the pillars of a healthy parish and makes parish life thrive.
- Adoration is a rich source of grace for each soul who comes before the Lord. In His presence our hearts are united to His Sacred Heart and we receive peace which cannot be found elsewhere.
- By offering ourselves before The Lord, we bring the grace of conversion to souls around the world. Through our Adoration of our Eucharistic Lord we are part of saving the world.
- A partial Indulgence is granted the faithful who make a visit to the Most Blessed Sacrament for the purpose of Adoration, this becomes a plenary indulgence if the visit is for at least one half hour.

I hope you will plan on being there each evening and spending some private time in prayer on Tuesday and Wednesday. This is also the perfect opportunity to invite someone new or someone who has not been with us for some time. A kind invitation is sometimes all it takes to save a soul. What rejoicing in heaven there will be when you invite someone to our 40 Hours!
