## A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

I recently read an article by Eric Sammons, a Catholic Author and Editor in Chief of Crisis Magazine.

Crisis is a pretty reliable source of both news and Catholic commentary and its online version is free. In this latest article Sammons writes about how good and faithful Catholics can sometimes be more Catholic than the Church herself in trying to defend the deposit of Faith. In other words, sometimes, in trying to remain faithful to our Faith we can find ourselves positing opinions that are not actually defined dogmas of the Faith.

One of the examples he gives is the debate over alien life. Did God create intelligent life, other than humans and angels? (And yes, human life actually is intelligent, though we do not always act it.) Some have tried to say that the existence of alien life is actually contrary to our faith. But the real answer is we really do not know for certain and despite the strong objections of some on theological grounds, the Church has never taught anything definitively one way or the other. And that makes perfect sense, since there is nothing in God's revelation that gives any sense of this one way or the other. God's revelation is directed to providing all we need to know for our eternal salvation and the existence of alien life does not at all affect that. And so we wait and we see.

There are good theological arguments on both sides, but none are "de fide", meaning none of these arguments are revealed truth. So, while it can be fun to speculate, we should realize that as yet there is no definitive answer and we are free to believe either way so long as we do not add or subtract from what we know is Divinely Revealed. The danger some who believe in alien life fall into is that UFO chasing becomes a false religion, which replaces belief in the One, True God.

One thing that seems certain and that Sammons points out, is that at least, given the spiritual nature of the encounters, some peoples' claimed alien encounters are actually encounters with demons posing as alien life. Why would demons do this? To deceive and cause fear for one. Also, it is not beyond the realm of possibility that demons would want to give us technology that would be destructive for us. We should be very careful to believe in an alien encounter without any real proof.

A common argument for the existence of life on other worlds is that this great and vast universe could not have been created just for us. That argument fails to remember that God gave us only Son. Compared to His Son, the universe does not seem like so much to give just to us.

Many good scientists believe that if intelligent life exists on other worlds, it is highly unlikely that this life has visited us. They say this because of just how big the universe is and how difficult it is to travel these great distances. Still I wonder, if such life exists, and if an alien race, unlike us, did not sin, did not suffer a fall from original grace, how advanced this race might be. They would also, in that case, have a combination of great wisdom and of great benevolence.

There are many more arguments on both sides of this, but what we need to know is that whether there is life on other worlds or not and whether such life is intelligent or not, it does not change our Faith at all. If there is other life "out there", or even if "they" are right here among us on earth, then the God we know, Who has revealed Himself to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, has created this life and all of this is part of His great plan, a plan for our good!
