A Message from Our Pastor:




Lent is right around the corner. In these last few days leading up to Ash Wednesday, it is a great idea to make a personal plan for Lent. By the way, Ash Wednesday is March 5th, and we will have Mass at 7AM with the distribution of Ashes. Adoration will begin at 9AM and Ashes will again be offered after the 6:30PM Benediction.

A personal plan should include a prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It is best to keep it simple and realistic. It is also great to plan on joining in the things we will have as a parish, such as Stations of the Cross and our Sunday Catechism and Lunch series, the topics for which I will announce next week. Every Wednesday, beginning on March 12, we will have Stations after the 6:30PM Benediction. We will also have a group that prays the Stations on Fridays after Divine Mercy and Rosary at 3PM. You might also consider making time for Wednesday Adoration or coming to Mass during the week. And of course there will be extra times for Confession during Lent, as we approach Holy Week.

Here are 20 other ideas I found of things you might consider for your Lenten Plan:

- 1. Think of what you typically spend a lot of money on. Do you buy too many clothes or eat out too often? Consider fasting from one of these and maybe donate the money to charity.
- 2. Take on 40 days of doing something particular like saying a particular prayer each day or doing 40 acts of kindness.
- 3. Pray before work. What is the first thing you do when you get to work? Check email? Consider taking 5 minutes to pray.
- 4. Attend week-day Mass once a week, or one extra day if you already go.
- 5. Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy every day.
- 6. Start a Lenten Journal. Take some time each day in prayer and reflection on your spiritual journey and jot down what comes to you.
- 7. Fast from music on your drive to work and use the time to pray instead.
- 8. Limit time on social media.
- 9. Fast from snacking between meals.
- 10. Volunteer at a food pantry, soup kitchen, or homeless shelter.
- 11. Write letters to those in prison, nursing homes, or the military.
- 12. Reach out to someone you know who may be in need of companionship or offer to run an errand for someone who cannot get out.
- 13. Give up soda, coffee, or alcohol.
- 14. Read the daily Scripture.
- 15. Think of a habit that keeps you from being who God wants you to be. Give it up! (Maybe this is something to journal about as you consider what that habit might be.)
- 16. Save money and donate it to the poor.
- 17. Spend one hour a week in Eucharistic Adoration.
- 18. Wake up without hitting the snooze button and use that extra time for prayer right away in the morning.
- 19. Every morning, scroll though your phone contacts. Randomly stop on a person and say a prayer for them.
- 20. Go through your closet and find clothes you can donate to someone in need. Don't just pick the clothes you don't like or will never wear. If you have kids, they can do the same. Maybe they could also find a few toys they would consider donating.

I hope these ideas inspire you to be creative and make a personal plan for you during Lent this year.


Miraculous Medal Novena
