A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

As we begin this holy season of Lent, we are invited by our Bishop to reflect on the gift of the integrity of body and soul, which is one of the great goods that God has bestowed on humanity, and also to reflect on one of the most pervasive and destructive threats to this good, namely pornography.

By the term integrity of body and soul we mean the right understanding of and respect for the God given meaning and purpose of our human sexuality. God made us male and female, but unlike the other creatures that are male and female, who simply reproduce following their natural instincts, humanity is given the gift and ability to share in the creative act of God, through the rightful use of our sexuality in the stable union of marriage, where the love of man and woman may be blessed by new life. The physical union of man and woman as husband and wife thereby becomes a physical sign of the spiritual bond of marriage, where the couple are joined together in a life giving union of love that is an image of the communion of God's own inner life.

There are few threats to this integrity more pervasive than pornography. This has become a billion dollar industry that exploits people, even minors, in so many ways and leads to the destruction of so many lives each day. This industry corrupts the young and leads many people of all ages into a captivity of soul that destroys healthy and good relationships, especially marriages. Through the use of the internet pornography has spread like a highly contagious and deadly disease. Our youth are exposed to it at younger and younger ages leading to an addiction that damages the persons ability to form lasting and healthy relationships.

Despite all this there is great hope! First and foremost God's grace does not leave us to fend for ourselves. What sin damages and weakens, grace restores and strengthens. The gift of our human integrity can be damaged by sin and evil but not completely destroyed. With God's grace and some practical guidance we can take action to make our homes, and our therefore our inner-selves, safe havens from the evils of pornography. The first step for those afflicted by the use of pornography is the Sacrament of Penance and the gradual deepening of a life of prayer. There are many practical steps that will be enabled by grace and will also enable grace to work within us. Grace always builds on nature. We must see God's grace as a power that works in us and especially with us. Grace is powerful but not magical. We have to engage our wills and our brains in being practical about avoiding sin and temptation. This is why our Bishop has asked us to have this First Sunday of Lent be a Safe Haven Sunday in our Diocese. If you or someone you love is struggling with pornography, there is help available to begin the path of healing and freedom, the path to a safe haven from this scourge. All parents are encouraged to make sure your homes are Safe Havens from pornography for your children. In this internet age we simply cannot take for granted that this internet disease is not in one's home.

To begin to create a safe or safer haven, you are invited to download the free guide called "Equipped: Smart Catholic Parenting in a Sexualized Culture", this can be found on the Diocese's Lumen Christi commission website at www.adlumenchristi.org under the Safe Haven Sunday tab. This free digital book is not only for parents but for everyone as you will learn some simple facts and basic theology and can adapt this for your own use. Here you will also find the "Safe Digital Challenge" which will help you make your homes safer from the threat of pornography. On this website there is also a tab with information for parents and a tab listing professional resources, basically professional counselors, who help people overcome this addiction. If you are struggling with this addiction, please do not be afraid to seek help. You do not have to remain a prisoner of this or any addiction and you do not have to be ashamed to admit you need some help. None of us is meant to get through this life alone. We are meant to be a

community of disciples helping each other on the way to salvation. God wants you to be free and He is providing both the grace and the assistance needed. Trust, Hope and Pray!
