# A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners.

With the election our new pope, there are now 14 Pope Leos in the history of the Church. I thought it would be interesting to see a little bit about them. The First Pope Leo, a saint who is called "The Great", and Pope Leo XIII are the most well known popes of that name.

Pope St. Leo the Great reigned as pope from 440-461. He is known for famously facing down Attila the Hun and preventing the sack of the city of Rome and the rest of Italy. He also was a teaching pope who advanced the Church's understanding of the papacy and of the understanding of Our Lord's human and Divine natures. He is honored as a Doctor of the Church. Only two other popes are bestowed the title "the Great", those being Pope St. Gregory I and Pope St. Nicholas I. There are some who wish to add Pope St. John Paul II to that list.

Pope St. Leo II served the Catholic Church as pontiff for less than a year from his coronation on August 17, 682 to July 3, 683. As a personally accomplished singer, he encouraged music in the church. Leo II also fought against heresy, approved the acts from the important sixth Council of Constantinople in 680 A.D., and kept positive relations with the Eastern Emperors in Constantinople.

Pope St. Leo III, the 96th pope, served the Church as the pontiff from the years 795 A.D. to 816 A.D. for more than 20 years. The interactions he had with Holy Roman Emperor Charlemagne caused lasting implications for the temporal and ecclesiastical

powers of the papacy and for relations with the Eastern empire and church. Sadly, he was not able to heal the divide between east and west and his support of the Emperor Charlemagne caused a lasting rift and pushed the papacy further into political life.

Pope St. Leo IV served in the role of pontiff as bishop of Rome and Papal States' ruler from April 10, 847 A.D. until his death in 855 A.D. He has been immortalized for his work building the Leonine Wall that surrounds Vatican Hill and for repairing the substantial damage to churches in Rome caused by Arab attacks on the city. During his time the threat of invasion was imminent. Leo IV also put together an Italian cities' defensive league to fight the maritime Battle of Ostia in which they defeated the Saracens. Pope St. Leo IV also dealt with high ranking clerics who abused their power, to the point of excommunicating one prominent Cardinal.

Next week we will continue to look at some of the Popes named Leo.

#### Miraculous Medal Novena


The prayers of the Miraculous Medal Novena are prayed publicly in our parish every Wednesday after the evening Benediction at 6:30PM. We offer public praying of the


