A Message from Our Pastor:

Today's Gospel remind us of a visit full of humanity that Christ Jesus made to the family of Martha and Mary. Both sisters were joyful to have the Lord visit them. One was busy serving tea and cooking, while the other was chatting happily with the Lord. It was truly a happy moment for the small, lonely family, now warmed and uplifted by the presence of the Lord. However, Martha was too focused on preparing a dinner. She wanted to make a sumptuous meal for the Lord. She even wanted her sister to stop talking with the Lord to help her prepare the meal. She boldly suggested to the Lord: "Please tell Mary to help me." This suggestion seemed to be rejected. Christ Jesus came not for food. He did not come to be served. The path the Lord takes to others is to love and serve. He does not want to be a burden to others. His presence in this house is to express care, solidarity, and empathy. Therefore, the Lord said to Martha: "Martha, you are worried about many things; the important thing is not serving, but listening to the Lord's words and teachings."

In fact, both attitudes are necessary: the spirit of hospitality is expressed specifically and actively through meal preparation, but it is equally manifested through heartfelt conversations. Jesus praises Mary's attitude, but does not diminish Martha's. He does not criticize Marth's activity and generous hospitality; He simply wants to use the image of Mary sitting at His feet to express the fundamental attitude that humanity must have towards God, which is the attitude of listening to the Word of God. The Word of God is everlasting and gives meaning to our daily activities.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta often began her busy schedule taking care of the poor by praying before the Eucharist early in the morning. She was admired by the whole world because of her works and selfless-sacrifice to the poor around the world.

Today, all of us are truly busy. We have little time to talk to each other. We have even less time to visit one another. Let us remember that without conversation, there will be no understanding and empathy for one another. Without human visits, relationships will fade over time. Sometimes, even family members do not have time to visit or talk to each other. The lack of human visits leads to growing distance. The absence of dialogue will result in lost empathy. True love does not stop at mere words. Love does not remain in feelings of compassion but must be committed to alleviating the pains of others, to healing the wounds of our brothers and sisters. True love always

requires closeness, empathy, and support. It is through closeness that we understand each other, empathize

with each other, and support one another.

May each of us know how to spend time with one another through visits, through acts of assistance, through caring with compassion. May each of us know how to forget our own ego to care for the concerns of our brothers and sisters, to live for others, to work together to build a world filled with love. Amen.
