A Message from Our Pastor:

People value money, seeing it as the key to success in life because it is honored by the saying:
"With money, you can even buy happiness." Some view the purpose of life as merely to earn as much money as possible for enjoyment, allowing their passion for wealth to dominate and lead them to do wrong things.
They see money as a solid guarantee for their lives. However, the author of the book of Ecclesiastes says:
"Vanity of vanities. All things are vanity" (Ecclesiastes 1:2). So, is money really a guarantee for life? Can we bring it with us the afterlife?

In today's Gospel, Jesus does not criticize the accumulation of wealth to become rich, nor does He disdain wealth. He only advises us that while accumulating money to get rich, we should also know how to be rich in the sight of God. We should not imitate the foolish rich man who only knows to accumulate material wealth for indulgence, treating wealth as a solid guarantee for life to live lavishly, while forgetting God and even his own soul. Moreover, we do not live forever; when we die, to whom will our riches go?

For us, wealth is not inherently bad because everything that God created is good. However, wealth can also become a faithful servant of ours or a harsh master that turns us into its miserable slaves. The Lord advises us to avoid greed and to share. One way to become rich in the eyes of God is to share and to help those in need. Everything we give away remains with us, and that is the basis for God to reward us abundantly in our eternal homeland. What we hoard miserly is not ours. What we give away and do for others is ours in the life to come.

There was a man who worked his whole life and saved a lot of money for himself. He was truly a cheapskate when it came to his money. He loved money more than anything else, and just before he died, he told his wife, "Now listen, when I die, I want you to take all my money and put it in the coffin with me. Because I want to take all my money with me to the afterlife."

The wife agreed without hesitation. Months went by, and the man sadly passed away. At the funeral, his wife approached the coffin with an envelope in hand. Solemnly, she placed the envelope inside the coffin with her husband.

Seeing this, the priest standing nearby asked the woman, "What's in the envelope?"

She replied, "My husband's last wish was to be buried with all his money. So, I had to make sure his wish was fulfilled."

The priest, puzzled, looked at the small envelope and added, "But dear lady, he was so rich. How could you fit all his

The wife responded, "Well, of course, there was too much, so out of courtesy, I transferred all his money into my account and wrote him a check."

We must remember that earthly things can never satisfy the human soul. Only God can give us the happiness that our souls crave. Therefore, Saint Paul says, "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth" (Col 3:2). And Jesus advises us, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and decay destroy, and thieves break in

and steal. But store up treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor decay destroys, nor thieves break in and steal" (Mt. 6:19-20). What makes us rich in the eyes of God is not what we have or what we do, but what we are.

May each of us always know how to use our inheritance, which is our talents and abilities, to gain friends for the Kingdom of Heaven in the future. Please do not accumulate the decaying treasures of this life, but rather accumulate merits for the life to come.
