A Message from Our Pastor:

We tend to hoard wealth, hustle to make a living, and seek to enjoy as much as possible, acting as if we will never die. Alongside majority of us who love life, enjoy pleasures, and prefer ease, but very few reflect on our own death and consider earthly riches as transient, fleeting, and ephemeral.

In today's Gospel, Jesus continually invites everyone to be vigilant: "Gird your loins and light your lamps" (Luke 12:35). Being vigilant is like the five wise virgins, who not only brought lamps but also oil; like the faithful servant waiting for the master to return; like the wise person guarding against the thief; like the wise servant acting according to the master's wishes. Vigilance does not mean being in a deep, slumbering sleep, but being awake even while resting. Vigilance also means being wise and promptly acting according to the will of one's master. Often, We Christians are very vigilant in prayers and moral obligations, such as keeping the first Fridays of the month or attending Mass on weekdays and Sundays, but we are often very drowsy in the demands of the Gospel.

Christianity is not a religion that lulls people to sleep. It is love; it is the way; it always awakens everyone. As a path to walk, Christians must be vigilant, because only by being awake and opening our eyes can we see the direction to go, and the purpose to reach a peaceful destination. Be awake to recognize the Kingdom of Heaven that is present. Be awake to avoid causing misunderstandings for others, to not distort the Gospel and the Church. Being awake is serving. And the more we serve, the more we will recognize the Kingdom of Heaven coming; the more we serve, the more we will become like Jesus Christ in His loving service.

Living in this world, we do not know when, at what hour, or at what minute we will die. Some of us still think that we will never have to die. Therefore, we cling to the world, living for enjoyment, living for fun, etc. However, the majority of us are very confused, anxious, and restless because God will come unexpectedly: "For the hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come" (Luke 12:40). The Lord will come when no one expects it. A thief always breaks in very unexpectedly, and his sharpest weapon is surprise. God also comes very unexpectedly, and He only reminds us to be vigilant. Do not cling too tightly, laboriously to the fleeting and ephemeral riches of this temporary life and forget about eternal life, the life to come. The Lord comes unexpectedly but is very interesting and joyful for those who know to stay awake, like the five wise virgins, like the steward who always wisely follows the will of his master. No one knows when they will die, but death will become a happiness for those who always know to awaken. The only fear is that people think they still have tomorrow, still have time to prepare, but in reality, the hour of death will come very suddenly and harshly. Therefore, the Lord always reminds us to stay awake. Stay awake to contemplate, appreciate, and discover the presence of God and the blessings He bestows, making our life brighter, fresher, and more meaningful.

May we always know to stay awake to overcome the earthly delusions. May we not lose our heavenly treasure for the fleeting fame and fortune. Amen.
