# A Message from Our Pastor:

Following Jesus requires us to pay the price and sacrifice, if not to go against the currents of life, in order to stay true to the values set forth by Christ. Therefore, the life of a Christian is seen as a constant battle with evil and social injustice. Today's Gospel is a testimony to us about that.

The Gospel today tells us that the Word of God brings division and not peace. In today's Gospel we hear one of Jesus' "sharp" words and it makes both the disciples and us also wonder, "Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division! From now on five in one household will be divided, three against two and two against three; they will be divided: father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law" (Luke 12:51-53).

Why is there this division? As we said: following God means that we are determined to live according to the values that God has brought into this world. And to be faithful to the values of that Gospel, it sometimes requires us to drastically sacrifice other values, to go against the behavior of those around us and our family members. From there, opposition and division will arise between parents and children, between brothers and sisters.

The exegetes (interpreters of the Bible) say that the division here is not the purpose of Jesus but the consequence of following him. And the war here is not a war between man against man, but a war against evil, the evil in man; it is a clash between the choices and values of followers and non-followers of God. But it is through this separation that man can re-establish the value ladder of life, with true values and peace on earth. Yes, to follow God, we must go against the flow of life, accept the opposition of others, and must fight the forces of evil and the devil.

Over and over again we realize that this life is only a preparation for the life to come. If we begin to make this life the center of our attention, we will forget that there are eternal values that form us. Once we realize that this life is a life that passes and never returns, we can begin to form our lives according to the Gospel: seeking the things that are above and being formed in values that will last forever.

That is the decisiveness of the Gospel, the price to pay for those who dare to follow the Lord in today's life. Let us face life bravely and with joy. There are ways to live that deepen our humanity and our love for one another. There are also ways to live that lead to an eternal death. Let us choose wisely and give thanks to the Lord.


