A Message from Our Pastor:

Today's Gospel tells us that a Jew came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Jesus does not answer directly: more or less people are saved. Because, more or less people are saved depends on their free choice. God always wants man to be saved, but requires human cooperation. To be saved, man must go through the narrow gate, as Jesus said: "Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able." Narrow gates are definitely harder to get in than wide ones. It is hard to get in so we have to try. We have to try to be little, for "Whoever becomes like a little child will enter the Kingdom of Heaven." We have to try to be humble, for "Whoever humbles himself will be exalted." We have to try to give up, because "Whoever wants to come after Me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." We have to try to live as loving and caring ones, "For when I was hungry, you gave me food, when I was thirsty, you gave me drink, when I was naked, you clothed me, when I was in prison you visited me."

The narrow way is the way of the Beatitudes, the way of the Ten Commandments. But there are countless ways to keep the Ten Commandments and the Eight Beatitudes. There are many people who take the narrow path through family life: those who strive to fulfill their duties as fathers, husbands, wives, mothers, children and other duties towards the family, the Church and society. There are many people who follow the narrow path of the evangelical counsels, that is priests, religious... They accept to live in poverty, chastity, obedience and devote all their energies to serve God and the Church. There are also people who are not religious or married, but are single in the middle of society to have more time to serve God and the Church. There are people who enter the narrow path by witnessing to their faith in God, justice, charity and love. They testify by word, deed and even accept to shed their blood for others as the church's martyrs.

On the contrary, there are many people who do not want to follow the narrow path. They are not willing to make sacrifices and give up. They refuse to "become little." They refuse to "humble themselves." They do not want to keep the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes. They get married but do not want to fulfill their duties as husband and father, wife and mother. They are children in the family but they don't want to honor their parents. As Christian Catholic living in the heart of the Church, they do not want to fulfill their assigned duties. They fall into evils: gambling, alcohol, sex, drug, deception, and corruption...and they refuse to repent and return to the right path. They do not know how to

Next weekend, at all masses, Rev. Paul Sunny will be speaking about the works and the needs of the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India. In 2021. Hurricane "Tauktae" left hundreds of families homeless. Monsoon sea-erosion each year, destroys several homes of the fishermen who live near the sea and make a living from fishing. The archdiocese is yet to recover from the crippling effects of financial devastation caused by the pandemic lockdowns. We humbly request your generous contribution to the second collection. Eucharistic Adoration is every Wednesday between 8:30AM and 6:30PM.


Miraculous Medal Novena


