A Message from Our Pastor:

Today's Readings and Gospel tell us to live humbly with everyone and to live in harmony with each other in sincere love. The leaders must know how to bow down to serve. The leaders must know how to be humble when living among others, know how to treat others with love selflessly. The Lord condemned the snobbery of the Pharisees because they loved to be recognized at the party; they loved to sit at the table of honor". They used their authority to be served by others. Their way of life is not helpful to the community but hurts the others. The Lord also teaches us that when having a banquet, we should treat even those who cannot afford to offer us a glass of wine in return. Do not invite each other in a "reciprocal" way, but the important thing is human love for each other. Man is nobler and more precious than money, above all earthly material things, so he must know how to put humans' love over profit calculations. Do not exclude our brothers and sisters for material gain, but use our wealth to buy the Heavenly friendship.

That is also the way of life that Christ Jesus has implemented throughout his earthly life. He chose to be born into poverty. He lived humbly in the middle of the village of Nazareth. He came to earth not to be served but to serve. It was at the Last Supper that he did his servant's duty when he stooped to wash the feet of his disciples. He is the Lord, the Master but does not care about his noble position; he only knows to lower himself to become a servant for everyone. Jesus does not choose a unique subject to serve. Jesus did not exclude anyone from the table that He himself provided. All people from east to west are invited to participate in the banquet that the Lord has prepared.

Today, Jesus still invites us to continue on the path that He has walked. The path of humility that he can come to live in harmony and to serve us. The way of pride leads us only to separation from others, and causes brokenness due to envy and jealousy. Regardless of class or race, each person is received with love and respect. With that, the world we live in will be peaceful and prosperous. Only then, will the world we live in be filled with love, joy and laughter.

However, in the midst of this life, there are still those who use superior power to oppress the underlings. In the midst of this life, there are still tears of the poor, disabled, unhappy, and elders who cannot find comfort and support of their fellow human beings. The world will not have peace and prosperity, if we do not know how to live humbly and support each other. The world will only have cries and grievances if there are still arrogant and unloving people on this planet. The world will fall apart if no one else bows down to serve one another.

Mission Appeal—August 30-31

This weekend, at all masses, Rev. Paul Sunny is speaking about the works and the needs of the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India. Trivandrum has about 270,000 Catholics. 90% of the people belongs to fishermen community, majority of whom depends on fishing for their livelihood. 10% are farm workers who are recent converts from low caste Hindus. Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in the communities. The archdiocese depends on outside contributions to support its clergy, seminarians, catechists, and the humanitarian projects of the homes for the orphans, aged and destitute, which provide food, shelter, health care, and education. In 2021. Hurricane "Tauktae" left hundreds of families homeless. Monsoon sea-erosion each year, destroys several homes of the fishermen who live near the sea and make a living from fishing. The archdiocese is yet to recover from the crippling effects of financial devastation caused by the pandemic lockdowns. We humbly request your generous contribution to the second collection. 
Miraculous Medal Novena

Pilgrim Virgin Statue Home Visitation Program




