A Message from Our Pastor:

Looking at today's social reality, one can see that people often chase after wealth, fame, status, and power. In this race, people have allowed money to dominate their lives, guiding and dictating both their way of living and their feelings. At that time, God, conscience, and character are pushed out of their hearts. Money and fame become idols, and they do anything to get it, even if it goes against conscience, moral principles, fairness, and charity, as long as they become richer and get promoted. Greed is never satisfied. Human ambition is never-ending.

Today's Word of God reminds us to use money to gain eternal life by sharing and helping others. Do not be harsh with our brothers and sisters. Do not accumulate unjust and dirty money. Use our abilities to help others. That is how we gain eternal life. Because one's life does not end with death. Life continues. The difference is that humans no longer act as stewards of the money that God has given. Humans are only in one of two states: enjoying eternal happiness because they have been generous stewards with others throughout their lives, or suffering eternal torment due to the loss of God's gifts and unfaithfulness in their duties to God and others. Therefore, the Lord tells us to use money to gain friends in the Kingdom of Heaven. We must use the blessings God has given—money, time, and ability—to show love to the unfortunate lives around us.

There was a man died and went to heaven. He met Saint Peter at the Pearly Gates who led him down the golden streets. They passed mansions after beautiful mansions until they came to the end of the street where they stopped in front of a shack. The man asked Saint Peter why he got a hut when there were so many mansions he could live in. Saint Peter replied, "I did the best with money you sent us."

From the above story, we draw this lesson: Only the "money given away" is the "money saved" that holds value for transactions in the afterlife and truly brings eternal happiness to us.

Remember that: We will not become rich before God with "earning" money, but with "giving" money. Only when we generously give to the poor can we truly be faithful and wise stewards who follow the will of the Lord. Only when we see money as a means to serve others can we prove ourselves to be loyal to God. Jewish Rabbis say: "The rich help the poor in this life, but the poor will help the rich in the next." When commenting on the story of the foolish rich man who built bigger barns to store more wealth, Saint Ambrose said: "The belly of the poor, the house of the widow, the mouth of the little child are barns that last forever." The Jews believe that almsgiving to the poor is recorded in the giver's account in the afterlife. Therefore, true wealth does not depend on what one holds, but on what one generously gives away.

May God help us use His gifts to buy the happiness of the Kingdom of Heaven through a life of charity and love for the poor and unfortunate brothers and sisters He sends to us. Amen.

on pilgrimage to Italy in the Summer of 2026, and all are invited to attend. The cost is \$3590 without airfare.






