## A Message from Our Pastor:

Today's Gospel tells the story of a rich man and the poor Lazarus. It's difficult. The rich man is dressed comfortably while Lazarus has a very difficult life. But after both of them died, God judged them fairly: Lazarus was comforted, sitting in the bosom of Abraham, while the rich man suffered greatly in hell.

While enduring torment from the netherworld, the rich man looked up and saw Abraham far away, and he saw Lazarus. in the bosom of Abraham. At that time, he begged father Abraham to have mercy and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and drop it on his tongue to cool him, because he was burned by fire terribly. The rich man's regret was too late!

Abraham said in detail: "My child, remember: you received your blessings throughout your life; and Lazarus received full of misfortunes throughout his life." Now, Lazarus is comforted here, while you must suffer. Furthermore, between us there is a great chasm, so that even if we want to cross over to you, we cannot, and even if those there want to cross over to us, they cannot. "This won't work either."

Unable to save himself, the rich man then pledged for his family members. He asked Abraham to send Lazarus to his five brothers' house to warn them and correct their way of life, lest they too end up in torment like him. But Abraham replied, "They have Moses and the Prophets; let them listen to them." The rich man said they wouldn't listen, but if someone came to them from the dead, they would repent.

Abraham replied, "If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be persuaded even if someone rises from the dead." That's right, there are so many warnings, but people are only scared when they first hear them, and after a few days, they forget everything, and things go back to the way they were!

Actually, the rich man's sin wasn't his wealth, but his indifference and lack of concern for the poor, sick Lazarus who was lying right at his gate. Living right next to each other without seeing or helping is truly an inhumane and immoral act. The rich man's sin of indifference will become a crime because he refused to help in time and Lazarus became exhausted and died, making him worthy of God's punishment in the fires of netherworld!

True wealth doesn't come from the possessions we accumulate, but from the possessions we give away. The truly rich are those who know how to generously share, while the truly poor are those who only know how to hold out their hands to receive. The truly wealthy are those with few needs, so they always feel fulfilled, while the truly poor have too many needs they want to satisfy, so they always feel lacking. True wealth is most valuable when it is spiritual wealth.

We should remember that happiness comes from giving; only by giving can we accumulate merit in this life and the next. On the contrary, an unhappy life is one that does not give. An unhappy person is selfish, only thinks of themselves, and only lives for themselves. The unfortunate will not experience the joy of giving. They live without a future because they did not accumulate merit for themselves in the afterlife thru acts of charitable sharing and humble service. Thus, we not only sin in thought, word, and deed, but also in our shortcomings in the duty of love, when we are indifferent to the suffering of others.

God created us with a heart to love, to feel the suffering of others and be moved with compassion. Don't be indifferent to unfortunate ones. Don't be indifferent to the suffering of our brothers and sisters. On the Day of Judgment, the Lord will not ask us if we were rich or poor. God will not ask us about our status, but He will ask about our solidarity with others. Are we charitable toward others? Are we too indifferent, even callous, toward our brothers and sisters? May the Lord Jesus always have compassion on all people, and may He help us always know how to share with our poor brothers and sisters. May we never be indifferent or apathetic to the suffering of others. Amen.



To participate, take a bottle from the baby stroller in the paved lot portico. Fill it with change or make a donation and bring it back and place it in the stroller.


Your donations will be collected, tallied, and checks will go to the centers at the end of the campaign. The campaign is currently underway and will go through the end of October.
