A Message from Our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Pentecost! On this great feast we celebrate the first outpouring of the Holy Spirit, Who enlivened the Church, bringing the Church to life. As we celebrate this feast we invite the Holy Spirit to renew the Church in the seven gifts of the Spirit. These gifts enable to live the life of discipleship faithfully and enable us to grow in grace and virtue. In fact, by the gifts of the Holy Spirit certain virtues may be brought to perfection within us. This action of the Holy Spirit requires a docility on our part to the work of the Holy Spirit. These gifts are all directed to our eternal salvation in that they orient us, direct us, to that end and further enable us to be witnesses to Christ in the world as we journey through this life to heaven. They are: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, piety and fear of the Lord.

- Understanding gives an intuitive penetration into truth. It is especially a deeper insight and penetration of divine truths held by faith, not as a transitory enlightenment but as a permanent intuition. Illuminating the mind to truth, the Holy Spirit aids a person to grasp truths of faith easily and intimately, and to penetrate the depths of those truths. This gift not only assists in penetrating revealed truths, but also natural truths in so far as they are related to our supernatural end.
- ✤ <u>Wisdom</u> perfects charity, in order to judge divine things. By the gift of Wisdom the Holy Spirit aids the contemplation of divine things, enabling the person to grow in union with God
- Knowledge perfects the virtue of hope, giving us a certitude about the promise of eternal life in Christ. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the human intellect makes correct judgments regarding earthly things and how they are related to eternal life and Christian perfection. As such, this gift is a special illumination, which enables the person to realize the emptiness of created things in themselves so that they do not become roadblocks to union with God. At the same time, it enables the person to see through created things to the God who created them.
- The gift of <u>counsel</u> perfects prudence, and helps develop the habit of choosing as God would have us choose. It enables one to be docile and receptive to the counsel of God regarding one's actions in view of sanctification and salvation. Primarily, this gift enables a person to judge individual acts as good and ought to be done, or as evil and ought to be avoided. The counsel is made in view of one's own personal sanctification and one's ultimate supernatural end. Therefore, this gift prompts the person to ask himself, "Will this act lead to holiness? Will this act lead to Heaven?"
- The gift of <u>piety</u> perfects justice in giving to others that which is their due. This is especially true of giving God what is His due. Here a person shows reverence for God as a loving Father, and respects others as children of God precisely because that is what they are. As such, this gift enables one to fulfill his obligations to God and neighbor; the person is not only motivated by the requirements of strict justice but also by the loving relationship he shares with his neighbor.
- Fortitude perfects the virtue of fortitude (or courage), in facing dangers, especially dangers that come form witnessing to Christ. This gift gives strength to the person to resist evil and persevere to everlasting life. In bringing the virtue of fortitude to perfection, this gift charges one with energy, perseverance and promptness. Moreover, it brings a confidence of success to the virtue.
- Fear of the Lord perfects temperance in controlling disordered appetites. Primarily, this gift entails a profound respect for the majesty of God. Here, a person realizes his "creatureliness" and dependency upon God, and never would want to be separated from this loving God. This gift of fear arouses in the soul a vibrant sense of adoration and reverence for the majesty of God and a sense of horror and sorrow for sin.


May each of us and the whole Church be renewed in the marvelous gifts of the Holy Spirit!
